listen and work with others for the greater good; we need people who won't shout about why things can't be done or look for who to blame. Instead we need people who want to build a society that works for us all not just the fortunate few, I am one of those people.

## On July the 5th 2016 I co-presented two petitions of grievance at Tynwald Hill.

One to overturn the decision to make the over 75's pay for a TV Licence and one to overturn the decision to make our pensioners pay for tram and train travel.

These petitions have been found to be in order and will be picked up in October by Mr David Cretney MLC.

Like you, I have many areas of concern but rather than list them all I have highlighted some that I feel are amongst the most urgent national issues.

Health and social care needs more money not more cuts. The island spends significantly below the 10.4% of GDP that is the average spent by other developed countries. There are efficiency savings to be made but we also need to provide 'new money', so I would support a new ring-fenced health tax.

Undertake local authority reform and complete the all Island rates review. Local authorities are expected to take responsibility for the delivery of an increasing number of local services, achieving this will require the efficiencies delivered by an economy of scale.

All too often it has been our older generation that have suffered the privatisations of this administration so the MLP are working closely with the University of the 3rd Age on a proposal for an Older Person's Commissioner for the Island, an independent voice and champion for older people across the island, someone to stand up and speak out on their behalf.

I want to protect our fisheries and farmers by ensuring that any Government support is targeted at those who are actively working in the industries.

Revisit the Open skies policy and if necessary amend to ensure it delivers fair and sustainable air services for the Island.
